

# CONTRACT FOR AGING SERVICES PROVIDED THROUGH THE OLDER AMERICANS ACT AND STATE APPROPRIATED FUNDS FROM THE NORTH CAROLINA DIVISION OF AGING

### July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022

This Agreement, entered into as of this 1<sup>st</sup> day of July 2021, by and between the County of Bertie (hereinafter referred to as the "provider") and the Mid-East Commission Area Agency on Aging (hereinafter referred to as the "MEC").

### Witnesseth That:

WHEREAS, the MEC and the provider agree to the terms and conditions for provision of aging services in connection with activities financed in part by Older Americans Act grant funds, provided to the MEC from the United States Department of Health and Human Services through the North Carolina Division of Aging and Adult Services (DAAS) and state appropriations made available to the MEC through the North Carolina Division of Aging and Adult Services Services Services, as set forth in a) this document, b) the Division of Aging and Adult Services Service Standards Manual, Volumes I through IV, and, c) the Division of Aging and Adult Services Community Service Providers Monitoring Guidelines.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of these premises, and mutual covenants and agreements hereinafter contained, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Availability of Funds</u>. The terms set forth in this Agreement for payment are contingent upon the receipt of funding by the MEC.
- 2. <u>Grant Administration</u>. The grant administrator for MEC shall be Bryant Buck, Executive Director. The grant administrator for the provider shall be Venita Thompson, Director. It is understood and agreed that the grant administrator for the provider shall represent the provider in the performance of this Agreement. The provider shall notify the MEC in writing if the administrator changes during the grant period. Specific responsibilities of the grant administrator for the provider are provided in paragraph six (6) of this Agreement.
- 3. <u>Scope of Services:</u> The provider shall do, perform, and carry out in a satisfactory and proper manner, as determined by the MEC, the agreements and assurances required in the request for proposal.

The provider shall submit an annual report to the MEC no later than July 14, 2022. Services authorized through this agreement shall be undertaken and pursued in such sequence as to assure their expeditious completion. All services required hereunder shall be completed by June 30, 2021. No state funds can be dispersed after the close of the fiscal year. Projected June expenditures must be reported with May services reported in June.

- 4. <u>Assignability and Contracting</u>. The provider shall not assign all or any portion of its interest in this Agreement. Any purchase of services with grant funding shall be carried out in accordance with the procurement and contracting policy of the provider or, where applicable, the MEC, which does not conflict with procurement and contracting requirements contained in 45 CFR 92.36. Federal funds shall not be awarded to any subreceipients who have been suspended or debarred by the Federal government. In addition, Federal funds may not be used to purchase goods or services from a vendor that has been suspended or debarred from Federal grant programs.
- 5. <u>Compensation and Payments to the Provider</u>. The provider shall be compensated for the work and services actually performed under this Agreement by payments to be made by the MEC. Total reimbursement to the provider under this Agreement may not exceed the grand total of available funding.
  - (a) <u>Reimbursement of Service Costs.</u> Reimbursements of service costs are carried out as provided in Section 3 of the N.C. Division of Aging and Adult Services Home and Community Care Block Grant Procedures Manual for Community Service Providers, revised February 17, 1997.
- 6. <u>Reallocation of Funds and Budget Revisions</u>. Any reallocation of funding between providers shall be voluntary on the part of the provider and shall be effective only for the period of the Agreement. The reallocation of funds between providers will not affect the allocation of future funding to the provider. If during the performance period of the Agreement, the MEC determines that a portion of the funds will not be expended; the grant administrator for the provider shall be notified in writing by the MEC and given the opportunity to make funds available for reallocation to other providers in the Planning and Service Area or elsewhere in the state.

Providers may request budget revisions during the period of the agreement, with final budget revisions due to the MEC no later than May 1, 2022.

Unless community services providers have been given the capacity to enter data into the Aging Resources Management System (ARMS), Area Agencies on Aging are responsible for entering amended service data into the Division of Aging Management Information System, as specified in the N.C. Division of Aging Home and Community Care Block Grant Procedures Manual for Community Service Providers, revised February 17, 1997.

7. <u>Monitoring</u>. This Agreement will be monitored to assure that services are being provided in compliance with the N.C. Division of Aging Service Standards Manual, dated July 1, 1992, and the N.C. Division of Aging Home and Community Care Block Grant Procedures Manual for Community Service Providers, revised February 17, 1997. Further, compliance with updated monitoring requirements, as specified in Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Circular A-133 and NC General Statute 143-6. shall be

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carried out. Monitoring shall also include compliance with conflict-of-interest requirements. Monitoring requirements are discussed in DOA Administrative Letter No. 03-14 (11/5/03). Private non-profit service providers will be monitored to ensure compliance with conflict-of-interest policies, as stated in DOA Administrative Letter No. 03-14.

The monitoring of services provided under this Agreement shall be carried out by the MEC in accordance with its Assessment Plan and/or by the DAAS regional Adult Program Representatives in accordance with the parameters of the interagency agreement established between the Division of Aging and the Division of Social Services, as provided in DOA Administrative Letter No. 98-13.

Providers will receive a written report of monitoring findings in accordance with procedures established in Section 308 of the AAA Policies and Procedures Manual (July, 1994) and DOA Administrative Letter No. 98-13. Any areas of non-compliance will be addressed in a written corrective action plan with the provider.

8. <u>Disputes and Appeals</u>. Any dispute concerning a question of fact arising under this Agreement shall be identified to the designated grant administrator for the MEC. In accordance with Lead Regional Organization (LRO) policy, a written decision shall be promptly furnished to the designated grants administrator for the provider.

The decision of the LRO is final unless within twenty (20) days of receipt of such decision the provider furnishes a written request for appeal to the Director of the North Carolina Division of Aging and Adult Services, with a copy sent to the MEC. The request for appeal shall state the exact nature of the complaint. The Division of Aging and Adult Services will inform the provider of its appeal procedures and will inform the MEC that an appeal has been filed. Procedures thereafter will be determined by the appeals process of the Division of Aging and Adult Services. The state agency address is as follows:

- 9. <u>Termination for Cause</u>. If through any cause, the provider shall fail to fulfill in a timely and proper manner its obligations under this Agreement, or the provider has or shall violate any of the covenants, agreements, representations or stipulations of this Agreement, the MEC shall have the right to terminate this Agreement by giving the provider written notice of such termination to the provider and specifying the effective date thereof. The date of notice shall be at least five (5) working days before MEC effective date of such termination. In such event, all documents and other materials collected or produced under this Agreement shall at the option of the MEC, become its property. The provider shall be entitled to receive just and equitable compensation for any work satisfactorily performed under this Agreement.
- 10. <u>Audit</u>. The Community Service Provider agrees to have an annual independent audit in accordance with North Carolina General Statutes, North Carolina Local Government

Commission requirements, Division of Aging and Adult Services Program Audit Guide for Aging Services and Federal Office of Budget and Management (OMB) Circular A-133.

Community service providers must provide a copy of their year end financial statements, and any required audit, to the MEC on Aging. Community service providers, as specified in paragraph one (1) are subject to audit and fiscal reporting requirements as stated in NC General Statute 143-6 and OMB Circular a-133, where applicable. Home and Community Care Block Grant providers are not required to submit Activities and Accomplishments Reports. For-profit corporations are not subject to the requirements of OMB Circular A-133, but are subject to NC General Statute 143-6 and Yellow Book audit requirements, where applicable. Federal funds may not be used to pay for a Single or Yellow Book audit unless it a federal requirement. State funds will not be used to pay for a Single or Yellow Book audit if the provider receives less than \$500,000 in state funds. The Department of Health and Human Services will provide confirmation of federal and state expenditures at the close of the state fiscal year. Information on audit and fiscal reporting requirements can be found at <u>http://www.ncgrants.gov</u>.

The following provides a summary of reporting requirements under NCGS 143-6 and OMB Circular A-133 based upon funding received and expended during the service provider's fiscal year.

- 11, Audit/Assessment Resolutions and Disallowed Cost. It is further understood that the community service providers are responsible to the MEC for clarifying any audit exceptions that may arise from any MEC assessment, county or community service provider single or financial audit, or audits conducted by the State or Federal Governments. In the event that the MEC or the Department of Health and Human Services disallows any expenditure made by the community service provider for any reason, the Community Service Provider shall promptly repay such funds to the MEC once any final appeal is exhausted in accordance with paragraph nine (9). The only exceptions are if the MEC is designated as a community service provider through the County Funding Plan or, if as a part of a procurement process, the MEC on Aging enters into a contractual agreement for service provision with a provider which is in addition to the required County Funding Plan formats. In these exceptions, the MEC is responsible for any disallowed costs. The County or MEC can recoup any required payback from the community service provider in the event that payback is due to a community service provider's failure to meet OMB Circular A-122 requirements, requirements of A-110, requirements of 45CFR, Part 1321, and 45CFR, Part 92, or state eligibility requirements as specified in policy.
- 12. <u>Indemnity</u>. The provider agrees to indemnify and save harmless the MEC, its agents, and employees from and against any and all loss, cost, damages, expenses, and liability arising out of performance under this Agreement to the extent of errors or omissions of the provider.
- 13. <u>Equal Employment Opportunity and Americans with Disabilities Act Compliance</u>. The provider shall comply with all federal and state laws relating to equal employment opportunity and accommodation for disability.

- 14. <u>Data to be Furnished to the Provider</u>. All information which is existing, readily available to the MEC without cost and reasonably necessary, as determined by the MEC's staff, for the performance of this Agreement by the provider shall be furnished to the provider without charge by the MEC. The MEC, its agents and employees, shall fully cooperate with the provider in the performance of the provider's duties under this Agreement.
- 15. <u>Rights in Documents, Materials and Data Produced</u>. The provider agrees that at the discretion of the MEC, all reports and other data prepared by or for it under the terms of this Agreement shall be delivered to, become and remain the property of the MEC upon termination or completion of the work. Both the MEC and the provider shall have the right to use same without restriction or limitation and without compensation to the other. For the purposes of this Agreement, "data" includes writings, sound recordings, or other graphic representations, and works of similar nature. No reports or other documents produced in whole or in part under this Agreement shall be the subject of an application for copyright by or on behalf of the provider.
- 16. <u>Interest of the Provider</u>. The provider covenants that neither the provider nor its agents or employees presently has an interest, nor shall acquire an interest, direct or indirect, which conflicts in any manner or degree with the performance of its service hereunder, or which would prevent, or tend to prevent, the satisfactory performance of the service hereunder in an impartial and unbiased manner.
- 17. Interest of Members of the MEC, Lead Regional Organization, and Others. No officer, member, or employee of the MEC, and no public official of any local government which is affected in any way by the Project, who exercises any function or responsibilities in the review or approval of the Project or any component part thereof, shall participate in any decisions or provisions of service relating to this Agreement which affects his personal interest or the interest of any corporation, partnership or association in which he is, directly or indirectly, interested; nor shall any such persons have any interest, direct or indirect, in this Agreement or the proceeds arising therefrom.
- 18. <u>Officials not to Benefit</u>. No member of or delegate to the Congress of the United States of America, resident Commissioner or employee of the United States Government, shall be entitled to any share or part of this Agreement or any benefits to arise here from.
- 19. <u>Prohibition Against Use of Funds to Influence Legislation</u>. No part of any funds under this Agreement shall be used to pay the salary or expenses of any employee or agent acting on behalf of the provider to engage in any activity designed to influence legislation or appropriations pending before Congress.
- 20. <u>Applicable Law</u>. This Agreement is executed and is to be performed in the State of North Carolina, and all questions of interpretation and construction shall be construed by the laws of such State.
- 21. <u>Disaster Assistance:</u> In the event that elderly individuals are endangered by the occurrence of a tornado, fire, flood, severe temperature extremes, or other disaster

related situation, the provider shall cooperate with requests for assistance from the MEC.

22. Attendance at MEC Meetings: The provider shall attend any committee; special meeting; or staff development training being held by the MEC to include the Regional Advisory Committee.

The disbursement amounts listed above represent 100% disbursement of total approved funds for the formula allocations for each program – Elderly and Disabled Transportation Assistance Program (EDTAP), Employment Transportation Program and Rural General Public (RGP). It is the responsibility of the County to comply with the provisions of the ROAP guidelines and to ensure that the receipt, expenditure, and any sub-allocation of funds are tracked for <u>each</u> <u>individual ROAP program</u>. Please refer to the program guidance in the FY2022 ROAP application package for eligible transportation assistance expenses and reporting requirements. ROAP program funds must be expended on eligible transportation operating expenses, as identified in the FY 2022 application.

**Rural General Public (RGP)** funds have a 10% local matching requirement. RGP funds may be used to provide up to, but not to exceed, ninety-percent (90%) of the fully allocated cost of each general public trip. The remaining ten-percent (10%) must be provided from fares, local funds or a combination of the two. Note however, that for each trip that is provided, the total of costs charged to the RGP program and the fare charged to the rider should not exceed the fully allocated cost of the trip.

**EDTAP & EMPLOYMENT** funds may be used to provide up to 100% of the fully allocated cost of the trip or allowable transportation related other service and requires no local match.

- 7. The Governmental Entity has the right to enforce the Distributor Settlement as provided therein.

- 8. The Governmental Entity, as a Participating Subdivision, hereby becomes a Releasor for all purposes in the Distributor Settlement, including but not limited to all provisions of Part XI, and along with all departments, agencies, divisions, boards, commissions, districts, instrumentalities of any kind and attorneys, and any person in their official capacity elected or appointed to serve any of the foregoing and any agency, person, or other entity claiming by or through any of the foregoing, and any other entity identified in the definition of Releasor, provides for a release to the fullest extent of its authority. 

Thank you for providing an opportunity to advance Bertie County Government's vision for developing sustainable funding models for the county's fire services into the future. We understand that upcoming decisions are a pivotal time for Bertie County Government and we commend executive leadership for taking due diligence in making informed decisions on establishing funding systems and structures that will be able to serve the people of Bertie County for many years ahead. We value and are honored by the opportunity to again work together with Bertie County leadership to build, develop and strengthen service delivery systems for the people of Bertie County as you move forward.

In follow up to the countywide fire service analysis that we conducted back in 2020 for Bertie County, we concur that Bertie County is well positioned to move forward with implementing a service district to support the fire protection service delivery system and help fund fire and rescue services that protect the people of Bertie County.

Our approach to this critical work will be to support Bertie County staff and assist you in navigating through the process over the approximate next nine months by helping you collaborate to help you **facilitate a transitional process** from where Bertie County is today totally dependent upon General Fund appropriation into a single, unified service district that will encompass most of the unincorporated areas of Bertie County and will include some of the smaller municipalities that choose to be a part of the streamlined, unified service district.

Harnessing best practices from other North Carolina counties, coupled with experience from various subject matter experts within North Carolina, we will guide county staff through various steps of the process to positively make the transition to the more optimal unified service district model.

Initial, principal goals and projected outcomes of this unified service district include, but are not limited to:

- Establishing sustainable funding systems/structures long-term for the fire service in Bertie County.
- A higher level of equity in levels of service delivery across the unincorporated areas of Bertie County, enabling service contracts with all service providers to be more similar in terms of expectations of services delivered, response times, first unit arrival, full complement, etc.
- More uniform inclusion and engagement by municipalities that choose to be a part of the unified service district across the county.
- Establishing a strengthened governance structure for the Bertie County Board of Commissioners for unincorporated fire protection by establishing a commission (or similar) comprised of both fire service and citizens that will review fire service funding issues and make authorized, researched recommendations to the Board of Commissioners for adoption.
- Enabling Bertie County to modernize their service delivery contract with provider fire departments and ensure closest station response across the county's jurisdiction.
- Develop dynamic funding formulas for each contracting fire department that reflect several key indicators of hazard and risk and represent a fair and realistic reflection of the cost to protect each response area. These funding formulas should reflect data from multiple years and fairly represent municipal needs in a balanced cost share model so that there is parity for all taxpayers when contracting fire departments serve both unincorporated areas as well as municipalities.
- Strengthen accountability at all levels of the delivery system including funding, equity, governance, and services provided.

To assure full accountability to Bertie County Government, we would propose to conduct these technical professional services on a month-to-month basis, reporting to you in a written report what tasks have been completed in the past 30 days and project the scheduled work for the coming 30 days. This periodic structure/process would provide a regimented formal opportunity for you to provide direction and/or redirection on course or speed of work that we were performing.

We recognize and respect that Bertie County has limited resources to invest in this initiative. Therefore, we have constructed a very conservative scope of work for this initiative below reflecting approximately <u>60 professional services hours</u>. NC Fire Chief Consulting proudly serves as the North Carolina League of Municipalities (NCLM) official fire consulting provider. As such, we provide a 20% discounted hourly rate to all NCLM members through our contract with the NCLM and we extend that same contract to NC Association of County Commissioner members. We only invoice for actual hours worked. Based on the projected scope of work below at 60 hours at the discounted

contract rate of \$159 per hour, the total project could accumulate to \$9,540. Beyond the professional services hours, monthly invoices will include reimbursement for mileage and per diem at the current federal/GSA rate and any other pre-approved reimbursements. To conduct the scope of work as stated in this document will not exceed a total of \$11,000, including reimbursements. Any work beyond the stated scope will be at the same hourly rate and reimbursement schedule and will require a written commitment by both parties at least in the form of email correspondence.

We understand that you desire for this scope of work to be complete by September 30, 2022 or before. We can accomplish that task if we are provided with the necessary information to conduct analysis and provide feedback in the prescribed manner on a timely basis.

Please review the proposed scope of work as outlined below and let us know how we can modify this to best meet the needs of Bertie County for this most important initiative.

We look forward to collaborating to strengthen and improve the fire protection service delivery system in Bertie County. Please let us know how we can best help moving forward.

If this road meets the requirements necessary for addition, we agree to grant the Department of Transportation a right-of-way of the necessary width to construct the road to the minimum construction standards of the NCDOT. The right-of-way will extend the entire length of the road that is requested to be added to the state maintained system and will include the necessary areas outside of the right-or-way for cut and fill slopes and drainage. Also, we agree to dedicate additional right-of-way at intersections for sight distance and design purposes and execute said right-of-way agreement forms that will be submitted to us by representatives of the NCDOT. The right-of-way shall be cleared at no expense to the NCDOT, which includes the removal of utilities, fences, other obstructions, etc.

General Statute 136-102.6 states that any subdivision recorded on or after October 1, 1975, must be built in accordance with NCDOT standards in order to be eligible for addition to the State Road System.
