Absentee ballots will be mailed to voters who have requested them beginning January 12, 2026. A voter can fill out an absentee ballot request at votebymail.ncsbe.gov, or by filling out a request form provided by the county board of elections office. **The request must be received through the website or by the Bertie Board of Elections by 5:00 p.m. February 17, 2026. The deadline to return absentee ballots is Tuesday, March 3rd at 7:30pm.**

In the primary election, voters will select nominees for a political party to move on to the November 3rd General Election. **Contests on the ballot include U.S. Senate, U.S. House of Representatives, Supreme Court Associate Justice, NC Court of Appeals Judge, Superior and District Court Judge, NC House, NC Senate, Local Judges, Sheriff, County Commissioners and Clerk of Court.** In Primaries, voters affiliated with a political party will be given a ballot of candidates for their party. Unaffiliated voters may choose the ballot of candidates for any party primary but they may select only one party's ballot.

The Voter Registration deadline for this election is 5:00 p.m. Friday, February 6, 2026. Eligible individuals who are not registered by that deadline may register and vote at any early voting site during the

early voting period. New registrants will be required to provide documentation of their residence (for example, a government ID, other government document, or a paycheck, bank statement, or utility bill). Voters who wish to change party affiliation must do so by the February 6th deadline.

Voters voting in person are entitled to assistance by an election official, or, if assistance is needed due to disability or illiteracy, by a qualified person of their choice. Registration facilities and voting sites are accessible to all voters. Curbside voting is available for voters who are not physically able to enter voting sites.

Voter Photo ID is required for voting. Acceptable IDs include the following:

- North Carolina driver's license
- State ID from the NCDMV (also called "non-operator ID")
- Driver's license or non-driver ID from another state, District of Columbia or U.S. territory (*only if voter registered in North Carolina within 90 days of the election*)
- U.S. Passport or U.S. Passport card
- North Carolina voter photo ID card issued by a county board of elections
- College or university student ID approved by the State Board of Elections
- State or local government or charter school employee ID approved by the State Board of Elections
- Military or veterans ID card issued by the U.S. government
- Tribal enrollment card issued by a tribe recognized by the State or federal government
- ID card issued by an agency of the U.S. government or the State of North Carolina for a public assistance program

Voters unable to provide an Acceptable Voter Photo ID may complete a Photo ID Exception Form and will be offered a Provisional Ballot.
