IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING REPAIRING FLOOD-DAMAGED PROPERTY

This information is being provided in an effort to help citizens understand the process for repairing flood-damaged property. Please remember, there will be no fees charged for any permits for storm damage, but paperwork must be completed to comply with NC Building Code and the National Flood Insurance Program.

Once you have removed flooded materials and started the drying out process, please make sure the following permits have been issued:

- 1. Contact the Planning & Inspections Office 252-794-5336
 - ➤ The Building Inspector needs to see the structure <u>BEFORE</u> repairs are made to determine what permits are required.
 - Permits and inspections are required for:
 - Electrical work, including changing or moving outlets
 - Structural repairs prior to replacing wall covering/sheetrock
 - Replacing insulation
 - o Replacing HVAC systems and/or ductwork
- 2. Contact the Floodplain Administrator's Office 252-794-5336 or 252-794-6185
 - > Flood Development Permits are required.
 - The Floodplain Administrator will need to issue flood development permits for any work and repairs completed for property located in the flood zone.
 - ➤ Before repairs are completed, a Substantial Damage Determination should be made for your property.
 - Substantial Damage and Improvement to property means that the cost of the repair and improvement is equal to or greater than 50% of the predamage/pre-improved value of the structure.
 - The NC Building Code as well as the local Flood Damage Prevention
 Ordinance require substantially damaged structures be compliant with current code.
 - Please find out if your property is substantially damaged before you are too far in the repair process!
